On Second Thought...

Many times I feel disconnected from God. Whew! There, I said it. Now you know. I know the problem isn't with God - it's with me. After all, God promises in Scripture to always be there; to always be faithful, true, and constant. I also know that God is not a liar, that God's Word is true and can be trusted. I know this because: I have experienced this truth over and over again in my life, I know many wonderful people who have experienced this truth in their lives, and because of the Great Cloud of Witnesses who have testified to this truth throughout history. Still...the knowledge of this truth does not keep me from feeling disconnected from God at times. I am willing to wager you have felt the same on occasion. I have noticed that, for me, these times usually come when life is happening - the schedule is full, the daily grind of work and chores and errands eats away at my time, tragedy or sorrow strikes, or I just haven't carved out the time to invest in my relationship with Christ the way I know that I should. Like I said – the problem isn't with God, it's with me.

There are many different things that we can do to connect or re-connect with God. We call these Spiritual Disciplines. Because we are all different, some work better than others for us. Different ones have and have not worked for me at different times, depending upon my season of life, my mood, my motivation, or what's going on around me. But there is *always* one that works for me and I would like to share it with you, because my experience has been that it almost always works for every person I've ever known. The reason I think it works for most people is because it is so *basic* – to God and to us – and when we start with something basic in a relationship, something foundational that two people have in common, it is so much easier to connect.

The very first thing we read about God in the Bible is this: *In the beginning, God created*... (Genesis 1:1) This statement tells us something basic, and crucial, about the nature of God: God is a *creating* God. It's the first thing God wants us to know. Then we are told that God creates *us* in his image. This means that we, too, are by nature creative! The most basic, fundamental thing we have in common with

God is that we are both *creative beings*! Granted, on greatly different scales, but the *essence* of who we are and what we are about is the same. God creates, and so do we. God is creative, and so are we. So, I have learned that if we want to connect with God – we should be creative!

Every time I am creative, with the intention of connecting with God, it works. And this is true for everyone I've known and discussed this with. When we are being creative we are connecting with that *imago Dei* inside of us and with the Creative Force of the Universe that is so much greater than we are. We feel connected to something larger, infinite, full of purpose and meaning – in other words, God! I would even go so far as to say we human beings can never feel more deeply connected to God than when we are being creative.

"But Pastor Tim!" you say, "I'm not creative!" Phooey. Don't mistake being artistic with being creative. Some people are artistic, some people are not, but everyone is creative. Think about children for a moment. Every child is creative. We encourage creativity and imagination in children, but somewhere along the way we stop doing that. We learn that we need to be responsible and serious and conform to society's expectations. Creativity is no longer rewarded the way it once was. Perhaps the reason adults are always so amazed at the creativity of children is because we have simply forgotten how to be that way! Perhaps the reason people like Mr. Rogers and Dr. Seuss are so admired by so many adults is because they never lost touch with that childlike creativity that is buried deep inside every one of us. They represent who we long to be!


For me being creative means playing music alone or with others, being in or helping put together a theater production, writing a song or poem, or working on the book I've been writing for the last 15 years! But for my friends it can mean any number of things: gardening, woodworking, painting, cooking, leather craft, sewing, building a computer, photography, building models, making movies, designing things, or just engaging in play time with kids are all ways friends of mine engage their creative side. I have one friend who buys old furniture at thrift stores and then, along with her 6 year-old daughter, paints it bright colors to give to others as gifts! It can be anything *you* need it to be that connects you with God!

So this fall I challenge each of you to be creative! Even if you aren't feeling disconnected from God, find time to be creative. Be childlike in your creativity! Remember when you gave your mother that unrecognizable glob of goo on paper and told her that it was a picture of her? Remember how she fussed over it and praised you and hung it up for all to see like it was the Mona Lisa? That's the pride God has in us when we are creative! Don't get bogged down in thinking it has to be good. This isn't *American Idol* or *America's Got Talent* and God isn't Simon Cowell! God isn't going to judge; God just wants it to be an expression of who you are. Turn off the TV, put down your handheld screen, and tune into your creative side. Invent a game and play it with your family or friends; paint something; plant a garden; write a poem; cook a gourmet meal for people you love. Create for yourself and for God. You might be surprised at how much the two of you have in common.



Sunday, October 30th is Reformation Sunday. Reformation Sunday is celebrated on the October Sunday in closest to October 31st, the anniversary of the Martin Luther date nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the church thus beginning the Protestant Reformation.

American Presbyterians usually acknowledge John Knox on this day, since American Presbyterianism can be directly traced to Knox's worship reforms in Scotland in the late 16th century. It is important to note, however, that for Presbyterians there are three phases of the Reformation that influence and inform our Tradition: Luther's reforms in Germany in the early part of the 16th century, John Calvin's reforms in Switzerland in the middle of the century, and Knox's reforms in Scotland a number of years later. Calvin was influenced by and built upon Luther's work, and Knox did the same with Calvin a generation later.

With this in mind, this year we are going to begin a cycle of Reformation three-year celebrations that acknowledges the tripod upon Reformed Tradition rests. which our Reformation Sunday this year we are going to celebrate Martin Luther and his contribution to the Protestant Reformation. The worship service will be modeled after Luther's worship reforms and the liturgy that day will be taken from the German Reformed Church's Reformation Day celebration. This worship service will be nearly identical to what we would have experienced in a German Protestant church in the latter part of the 16th century.

In subsequent years we will celebrate Calvin and Knox, basing our worship services on their reforms and the prayers and liturgies they used. Hopefully this will be an uplifting, as well as educational, worship experience that will help us come to a deeper understanding of the richness and variety of the Reformed Tradition. We hope you join us on October 30th to celebrate this special day.


WELCOME PASTOR TIM






A brief congregational meeting has been called for October 16th immediately following worship, to elect two at-large members to the Officer Nominating Committee.

Second Presbyterian Church has recently begun live streaming of the Sunday services via the internet. In order to accomplish this we are looking to create an "A-V Team" of volunteers to help run the audio and video portions of this new aspect of our worship program.

A technical knowledge of the equipment being used is not a requirement. Most of the video functions will be pre-programmed and simple to operate. Efforts are underway to simplify the operation of the sound system as well. We already have two students learning the basics of the sound system and will also be training them on the video side. What is hoped is that we can also get some adults in the program to help provide continuity and spread the workload out so that volunteers could work on a rotating schedule, ideally one Sunday per month (or more if desired!). Those interested in working with just the video or sound are encouraged to volunteer as well.

Paul Sexauer will lead the team and be present each Sunday to handle any technical issues which may arise. He will also coordinate the training for all volunteers. As mentioned, this does not require any technical background on your part, but those wishing to delve into that aspect are welcome to do so.




Aging with Dignity


Maryville College Scholarship to Honor Second Presbyterian

Come hear Rev. Luis Fernando Sanmiguel share the struggles of reaching a lasting peace in Colombia.

For 160 years, the Presbyterian Church has had a presence and witness in Colombia. But that presence has never been more important than it has the past 30 years. Rev. Luis Fernando Sanmiguel has worked closely with government leaders and opposing rebel forces to bring a lasting peace to his country.

Rev. Sanmiguel serves as pastor of the Community of Hope Presbyterian Church in Colombia. A peace advocate for more than 25 years, he has been involved in a variety of social justice and human rights activities, including peace talks between the Colombian government and guerilla



groups such as the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC-EP) and the National Liberation Army (ELN).

Sanmiguel's work also includes serving on the Commission for Social Oversight appointed by the Dialogue in Havana, Cuba. He also leads a peace project in the Presbytery of Uraba in Colombia and coordinates an interfaith movement in Bogota.

"I will share about the peace talks that have taken place as well as the social work of the church," said Sanmiguel. "I'm hoping my visit will strengthen ties of friendship and partnership between Colombia and PC(USA) churches. I hope it will promote evangelism and cultural exchange between our two countries, as well as different ministries of the church relating to children, youth, men and women's ministries and others."
