A gluten-free communion station is provided to the left. If mobility or health concern is an issue for you, self-serve cups are available at the sanctuary entrance.

TODAY IS PALM SUNDAY: Everyone is invited to pick up a palm as they enter the sanctuary to wave during the first hymn. All children and their families are invited to come to the Narthex at the start of worship to receive palms and parade through the sanctuary during the first hymn.

MAUNDY THURSDAY SERVICE: This Thursday, April 6th, we will celebrate Holy Thursday with music, readings from scripture, and communion. The service will begin at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary and we will follow Jesus from Table to Trial.

THE FLOWERING OF THE CROSS: Everyone is invited to take part in our annual "Flowering of the Cross" on Easter Sunday morning! Bring flowers from your yard, garden, the store, or even the side of the road with you to worship. Then on Easter Sunday morning prior to the service, come and place your flowers on the cross as you enter the sanctuary before you take your seat. Following the service (weather permitting), our fellowship time will be in the sanctuary courtyard and the flowered cross will be placed there for all to see.

KIRKIN' O' THE TARTAN: On Sunday, April 16th, we will celebrate the Kirkin' o' the Tartan during the morning worship service. The Kirkin' o' the Tartan service celebrates our Presbyterian Scottish heritage in worship. "Kirkin'" comes from "kirk," the Scottish word for church, so the phrase literally means the "Churching of the Tartan," though most people take it to mean "blessing" of the tartans.
