This drawing by Raphael was one of the initial designs for the tapestries commissioned by Pope Leo X in 1515 that were to be hung on the lower walls of the Sistine Chapel. The 10 tapestries were to be hung on the wall for special occasions and depict events from the lives of Peter and Paul. The drawings were completed in Rome and the tapestries were woven in Bruges. The drawings contain a depth of color that was not possible to reproduce in a tapestry. The original drawings reside in the Royal Collection in England, while the tapestries reside in the Vatican Museum.
