THANK YOU FOR WEARING A FACE COVERING: Face coverings are currently required for *all activities* in the church building, including worship, regardless of vaccination status. We also ask that everyone maintain at least 6 feet of physical distance between households.

COVID PRECAUTION PHASES: At its regularly stated meeting on August 17th, the Session of 2nd Presbyterian Church implemented four Covid Precaution Phases. Since it is clear that Covid is going to be present in our community for some time, the Session felt that it was best to create clear guidelines for Covid precautions that could be objectively measured and clearly communicated to the congregation. The phases are tied to the 7-Day Average Covid-19 Percent Positive Tests data provided by the Knox County Health Department each week (currently every Tuesday and Thursday). This metric has been a very good indicator throughout the pandemic as to the danger posed by the transmission of the virus in the community and the Session feels confident in using it as our primary guideline. The Session anticipates that we will move back and forth between these phases as the presence of Covid rises and falls in our community in the future. These phases will provide for the safety, health, and well-being of our membership and our visitors, given the level of Covid transmission in Knox County. If the data necessitates a move into a different phase, an email notification will be sent to the congregation and the website will be updated to indicate the current phase. The phases are available on the home page of our website and in the September 2nd Edition. Signs on the doors of the church building and the banner on the top of our website will always indicate the current phase. We are currently in Phase Orange.
