

# On Second Thought...

For the last few months we have been examining what we Presbyterians call the "doctrines of grace" - doctrines in the Reformed Tradition (our theological family) which help us systematically think about and understand the true meaning of grace. Essentially, it's what we believe and teach about sin and salvation.

You may not have noticed, but we learned these doctrines of grace using the acronym F.A.I.T.H

- **Fallen Humankind**: We are, by nature, dead in sin and therefore completely unable to save ourselves from sin and its consequences.
- **Adopted by God**: In love, God deliberately chooses to adopt us into his family.
- *Intentional Atonement*: Jesus died to save us from our sin, and this was God's plan all along.
- *Transformed by the Spirit*: The Holy Spirit enables us to understand spiritual things and begin to live in harmony with God.
- *Held by God*: We are held safely in God's hands for all eternity and therefore cannot lose our salvation.

For centuries a different acronym has been used to teach these Biblical truths. Perhaps you have heard of it: T.U.L.I.P. I prefer the F.A.I.T.H. acronym because T.U.L.I.P. is often misunderstood due to changes in language. Nevertheless, you may hear someone speak about T.U.L.I.P. when it comes to Presbyterians, so we should discuss it briefly.

**"T" is for Total Depravity:** This phrase describes the condition of a *Fallen Humankind*. People often hear this phrase, however, and think that it means the Bible teaches human beings are as bad as we can possibly be - "utterly" depraved. This is not correct. It simply means that we are so completely affected by our sinful nature that we are unable to contribute anything to our own salvation.

"U" is for Unconditional Election: The difficulty with this phrase comes from the word *unconditional*. It is not saying that God elects to save people no matter what. It is another way of saying that election is God's choice. We do not have to meet certain conditions before being chosen by God; there is no "if you do this, then God will do this." God chooses us through his will based solely on his love.

**"L" is for Limited Atonement:** Here, again, the phrase fails to accurately communicate the teaching of Scripture. Some people think it means that the sacrifice of Jesus is "limited" in its power, that it isn't sufficient to cover the sin of the entire world. Nothing could be further from the truth.



The limitation of the atonement is in its application. It is limited to those who are chosen by God. It is *sufficient* to cover the sin of all, but *effective* only for those whom God deigns to choose.

"I" is for Irresistible Grace: Some people hear this phrase and think it means God drags people to heaven against their will. The truth is that God does not work against our will, rather God loves us and draws us to himself. The Holy Spirit works in us in such a way that we desire to love God and do God's will. C.S. Lewis writes about how he kept holding God off, until he could finally resist no longer. God's grace was simply irresistible. Lewis borrowed a phrase from poet T.S. Elliot describing God as the "hound of heaven," in that God pursued him like a hound on the trail of a fox. God kept pursuing Lewis until he was caught; it's the same for us.

**"P" is for Perseverance of the Saints:** Believers persevere in their faith because God preserves his own people. This phrase is problematic as it puts the focus on us. Perhaps it would be better to speak of the *preservation* of God, but I like *Held by God* as much, if not more.

Ultimately, whether we use T.U.L.I.P or F.A.I.T.H, God's grace is something we experience and, therefore, cannot be fully explained. Think about the first time you fell in love. There is no way to adequately put into words the thoughts, emotions, and feelings of that experience. Poets and playwrights and songwriters have tried throughout human history and still have not exhausted the topic.

It's the same with grace. We are trying to explain something that we cannot comprehend, so any way of looking at it is going to fall short. I have found, however, that the F.A.I.T.H. acronym has given me a good hook to hang my hat on, so that I can focus on living a life of obedience in gratitude for the amazing grace that God has shown in choosing to adopt me into his family.

Our theme for Advent this year is Those Who Dream... It is inspired by the Revised Common Lectionary passages for Advent (Year B), with particular inspiration coming from Psalm 126: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream."

What does it look like to live as those who dream? The prophets, the psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, the shepherds and the magi – they were all dreamers. They received, discovered, and responded to God's dreams for the world. During Advent, we, too, have the chance to be dreamers, stepping into the mystery and awe of God's dreams as we pray for them to shape our reality.

This series is for those who dream of a deeper connection with God, for those who dream of a better world, for those who dream of comfort, and for those who have given up on their dreams. It is for those whose dreams have been crushed, and for those who show us that dreams take time.

# Scholarship Fund Update

The 200th Anniversary Scholarship Fund was established in 2017 as a lasting symbol of the long history of Second Presbyterian Church's support of education, as well as of our determination to continue that support for the future. For those unfamiliar with the scholarship fund, it is administered under contract with East Tennessee Foundation, with its purpose to award scholarships annually to undergraduate students at Maryville College and/or UT Knoxville on the basis of annual applications and stated criteria. To date, scholarships have been awarded in the amounts of \$4,000 in 2018 and 2019, and in the amount of \$5,700 in 2020. As of the end of the last reporting period (9/30/20) the balance in the fund totaled \$160,815.07.

Anyone desiring to make a gift to this endowment fund can make it payable to Second Presbyterian Church, specifying "Scholarship Fund" on the check or document of transfer.

A donation bin will be available in the vestibule for drop offs that occur Monday through Thursday during normal office hours. This opportunity will run through the end of the year and delivery to the court will be in early January.
