On Second Thought...

Hopefully by now you are aware of the Session's decision regarding the wearing of face coverings while in the church building. For those of you who aren't aware, or who haven't watched the video on the blog or read the letter on the website, here's the short version.

For all church activities, other than worship, face coverings are now optional while in the church building. We are still asking people to wear face coverings for worship. (This includes funerals and weddings, as they are worship services.) Beginning Sunday, July 4th, face coverings will be optional for worship, as well. In all cases we encourage you to make your choice based on vaccination status, personal health concerns, and personal comfort level.

I want to take just a moment to reiterate something I discussed in the video and letter, because I believe it is important. As we move forward, we need to shed ourselves of the mindset that wearing a face covering is anything other than a matter of personal choice and treat it as simply another piece of clothing. I know this has not been the case in the larger society, but it needs to be so here. We need to recognize the freedom that people have to act responsibly when it comes to wearing, or not wearing, a face covering.

This past Sunday was the first Sunday with our new bifurcated policy. I want to thank everyone for wearing face coverings in worship. I didn't see anyone not abiding by the Session's request, nor did I hear of anyone being argumentative about it. However, I did hear from a couple of people who said they felt "shamed" into removing their face coverings by others, either before or after worship. So I want to ask you - PLEASE - do not do this! *Please* do not encourage people to either remove or put on a face covering while in the church building. What is right for you might not be right for the next person, and vice versa.

I know we are all new to navigating the etiquette of face coverings, but we do not question the people who choose to wear a tie, nor we do encourage them to remove it if wearing one. We do not question the people who choose to wear a dress, nor do we encourage them to wear pants, instead. We accept that some people are comfortable dressing down for worship while others are more comfortable dressing up.



We need to approach face coverings the same way. If someone is more comfortable wearing a face covering, they shouldn't be made to feel uncomfortable doing so. Please don't encourage them to remove it. Accept their choice. If someone is *not* wearing a face covering, please don't encourage them to do so. Accept their choice. We want to avoid shaming people or making them feel defensive. As I have told my kids growing up, "You take care of you and let everybody else take care of themselves."

I get it - Covid has conditioned us to focus on what other people are doing, and for a very good reason...our own health, safety, and well-being. However, the science now tells us the vaccine protects us from getting seriously ill and from spreading the virus to others. So at this point, face coverings are mostly a reflection of personal comfort level. Mostly.

There is one other thing to be considered. Those who are immunocompromised are still encouraged to wear a face covering for extra protection. That person wearing a face covering could be undergoing cancer treatments, be HIV positive, have kidney disease, or have some other reason for continuing to wear a face covering. By encouraging them to remove it, we put them in the awkward position of revealing something they would rather keep private, or of putting their life in jeopardy just to avoid being shamed.

We are called to live with grace and to treat others with respect, not shame them. So please, for the sake of hospitality and for the sake of truly being a welcoming community, let's practice grace in our relationships with others. Let's not ask people why they are or are not wearing a face covering. Let's simply enjoy the fact that we can finally be together again safely.

Updated Covid Policies - May 19th

The Session has updated our Covid policies in light of the recent CDC guidelines. For the full rationale for these policies, you can visit our website. The health and safety of the entire congregation depends upon each of us following these guidelines, so we ask that you please read and familiarize yourself with them so that we may return safely and comfortably.

Face coverings: As of May 19th, face coverings are optional for those who are fully vaccinated while in the church building for meetings, Sunday School classes, Bible studies, or other activities, except for worship. We do request and encourage you to still maintain a safe physical distance from one another and the staff, especially if you choose not to wear a face covering.

We continue to ask everyone to wear a face covering during worship, as well as practice physical distancing and refrain from physical contact, regardless of vaccination status, through the end of June.

Beginning Sunday, July 4th, face coverings will be optional during worship for those who are fully vaccinated.

Face coverings are optional outdoors for anyone, regardless of vaccination status.

Safe Physical distancing: Each household is asked to maintain an appropriate physical distance and to refrain from physical contact with those outside of one's household, regardless of vaccination status. Worshipers are asked not to congregate in groups inside the sanctuary but are free to congregate and visit with one another outside in the Sanctuary Courtyard or other outdoor areas on the church grounds.

Nursery: The nursery is open during worship and childcare is available for children, infant to age 6.

Singing: Worshipers are asked to sing hymns quietly while wearing a mask. We will only sing two hymns in a service, rather than three, and we may sing fewer verses than normal. Hymnbooks are available for those who choose to use them. Hymn lyrics will be on the screen, however they will no longer be printed in the bulletin.

Bulletins/Bibles: Worship bulletins are available for those who desire one. For those who do not, all communal aspects of the worship service are displayed on a screen. Bibles are available in the pews for those who choose to use them.

Offering Plates: We will not pass offering plates during the service. Plates are placed at the entrances to the sanctuary and worshipers are encouraged to place their offering there, either as they enter or exit.

Communion: We will celebrate communion on the first Sunday of the month using self-contained communion cups. By mid-summer it may be possible to offer an optional intinction communion station up front for those who wish to come forward and partake of communion in this manner. This would be in addition to, not in place of, the self-contained communion cups. We do not see a return to "normal" communion until at least the fall.

Worship Leadership: The choir will remain as it has been during the pandemic, 6-8 scholarship singers properly distanced, wearing masks and rehearsing on Sunday mornings. The liturgists and pastors will lead worship from the lectern and pulpit. They will not wear face coverings while speaking in the lectern/pulpit but will wear face coverings the rest of the time.

The Worship Ministry Unit and Session will revisit these guidelines throughout the summer and adjust accordingly as case levels, hospitalization levels, and vaccination levels allow.


