On Second Thought...



Hey, there! Pastor Sarah here. I'll be guest "On 2nd Thoughting" while Tim is away. And since we just sent him off to begin his sabbatical, I thought it only fitting to address the importance of sabbath rest, not only for pastors or for those in academia, and not only for extended periods, but for each of us in our ordinary living.

In his commentary on the book of Genesis, Walter Brueggemann says this about sabbath:

The sabbath is a kerygmatic statement about the world. It announces that the world is safely in God's hands. The world will not disintegrate if we stop our efforts. The world relies on God's promises and not on our efforts. The observance of sabbath rest is a break with every effort to achieve, to secure ourselves, and to make the world into our image according to our purpose.

"The world will not disintegrate if we stop our efforts." This is so contrary to the way that we are conditioned to live, isn't it? We are encouraged to believe that any time spent that doesn't bear tangible fruit is time wasted. But, what Brueggemann says here, and what the Bible teaches us, is that taking time to just 'be' is incredibly valuable to our lives of faith and to our lives in community.

By taking breaks from our need to produce and the pressure to always be 'doing,' we might take a moment to breathe deeply, to notice God's creation all around us, to recognize the ways in which God continues to create all around us, and to find ourselves within and among God's creation. We might come to understand that, in fact, the world will not crumble around us if we fail to check everything off our to-do list. We might find that taking much needed rest renews us and replenishes our souls and helps us to see the image of God all around us.

So, while Pastor Tim is the one officially on sabbatical, why don't we all take this time to practice a little bit of sabbath of our own? Perhaps we can take this time to remind ourselves, too, that we need space to rest, that we need to take time away from the drive to produce that controls nearly every aspect of our society. Perhaps we can make a conscious effort during these summer months (and beyond) to take a break from productivity and production – to make space to just 'be' and to recognize God in our midst.



GO Ministry features ... West View Elementary School

Under our new organization for Ministry Teams, the GO team offers us an opportunity to share our gifts from God locally and throughout the world.

In 2009, SPC made a commitment to "get off the hill and into the city". Our new GO ministry is a continuation of that commitment. On that August Saturday in 2009, a large group of SPC members descended on West View Elementary School to help prepare for the arrival of students the following Monday. Crews worked inside preparing classrooms and student materials along with hallway bulletin boards. A major project was upgrading the library with new furniture, curtains and decorations. Outside, the grounds were cleaned up, flower gardens created and then mulched. The playground was resurfaced with special mulch, the equipment was cleaned and tables were painted. Throughout the school year our church members worked with students in multiple ways, assisting teachers, and providing support in the library.

The Knox County School System does not fund playgrounds, gardens or most landscaping. Rather, schools rely on parent organizations and outside groups to fund and provide these services. Because West View has had limited support from parental or outside groups, SPC has been a major provider until recently when, under a grant, West View was designated a Community School. This grant has provided a Site Coordinator who has developed the Community School Partners, a group of organizations helping West View. SPC is one of the Partners.

Saturday August 6, 2022 will be our 14th year to provide West View with this much needed "kick off the year" service. Mark your calendar now and plan to come join your SPC friends as we help the school and its students. We need you to help us GO!
