While we haven't had a huge number of people express needs, we have had a few. These volunteers have been wonderful at meeting these needs. We also have volunteers who are regularly calling those in the congregation who are alone or shut-in or in nursing homes and rehabs. These phone calls are bright spots in the day for these people.

I have been especially inspired by those individuals who saw a need, felt called to do something about it, and just did it, without being asked to or waiting for someone else to do it. As soon as we went to online only worship, Dick Dodson initiated Sunday School by conference call, and invited everyone in the congregation to participate, not just his Sunday School class. Liz Peebles is taking books and movies from the church library to folks who request them. Sandra Butler noticed it was time for the new Upper Room devotional books to be out and volunteered to deliver them to folks or let them come to her house to pick them up. Dean and Mary Farmer went helped Bobbie Denton learn to use her phone to connect to the Wednesday Night bible study. Ginny Williams sewed a cloth mask and cooked snacks for Patricia Kennedy, who continues to work during this time. The Henley's even sent cookies to my house! These are just a few of the things that I know about; I'm sure there are many other things you all are doing for each other.

I've also been inspired by the dedication of our staff during this time. Matt Mimbs has chosen some wonderful music for our Sunday morning online service, as well as playing the piano beautifully, singing occasionally, and getting the quartet ready for Easter Sunday. Since coming back to town, David has been there each Sunday to offer wonderful organ pieces.



She has stayed on top of all the different moving pieces, making it possible for Sarah and I to focus on helping everyone stay connected during this time. Audrey even has the church phone forwarded to her personal cell phone so we will never miss anyone calling the church for assistance.

Jan Barber is doing driveway visits, like Pastor Sarah and I, as well as making phone calls, sending cards and notes, and coordinating our volunteers to assist those in need. Holly Grimm is keeping our young people connected in so many ways. She created Lenten, and now Easter, Bible activity booklets from scratch and sent them to all of our young people. She meets with them twice a week on Zoom - once for Bible study and once for games. (Pictionary is a favorite!) She's also doing Instagram and Facebook games, delivering care packages, and encouraging our teens to call and write notes and cards of encouragement to shut-ins and other members of the congregation. As a parent I can tell you that our teens really appreciate staying connected with their church family during this time.

We are still finding ways to be welcoming, faithful, and, maybe most importantly, *hopeful* during this difficult time. It makes me so grateful and humbled to serve as your pastor.


VBS STANDS FOR OUR <u>V</u>ERY <u>B</u>EST <u>S</u>ERVICE.

AN UPDATE FROM UKIRK. THINGS LOOK VERY DIFFERENT FOR US AND WE KNOW THEY LOOK VERY DIFFERENT FOR YOUR CHURCHES TOO, BUT WE ARE ALL MAKING THE BEST OF IT. MINISTRY DOESN'T STOP JUST BECAUSE WE CAN'T GATHER IN PERSON, IF ANYTHING, IT IS NEEDED EVEN MORE SO.

UKIRK HAS BEEN GATHERING TWICE A WEEK ON ZOOM. ON TUESDAYS WE HAVE A VIRTUAL COFFEE HOUR FOR EVERYONE TO TALK FREELY AND JUST CATCH UP. ON THURSDAYS WE MEET VIRTUALLY FOR THEOLOGY TALKS WHERE STUDENTS CAN SUBMIT QUESTIONS AND THEN WE DISCUSS THEM AS A COMMUNITY. ON WEDNESDAYS WE HAVE BEEN AND WILL CONTINUE TO LIVE STREAM OUR WORSHIP SERVICES THROUGH THE END OF APRIL. WE CHOSE LIVE STREAM INSTEAD OF PRERECORDING WORSHIP BECAUSE WE LIKE THE IDEA OF WORSHIPING RIGHT THEN WITH OUR COMMUNITY EVEN IF FROM A DISTANCE. IN ADDITION TO ALL OF THIS, WE ARE SENDING DAILY DEVOTIONS TO OUR STUDENTS IN OUR GROUP MESSAGE, IN ORDER TO GIVE THEM A LITTLE BIT OF HOPE AND SECURITY DURING THIS ANXIOUS TIME. EACH OF OUR INTERNS ARE WRITING A DEVOTION ONCE A WEEK AS WELL AS BOTH STAFF MEMBERS.

CLASSES ARE ALL ONLINE FOR OUR STUDENTS AND SOME CLASSES HAVE PROVEN TO BE EVEN HARDER THIS WAY THAN IN PERSON. OUR STUDENTS ARE WORKING HARD DURING THIS STRANGE AND FRUSTRATING TIME. WE ARE PLANNING SOME FUN ACTIVITIES THROUGH ZOOM LIKE WE WOULD USUALLY PLAN OUR EXAM BREAKERS FOR EXAM WEEK. WE ARE TRYING TO BRING AS MUCH NORMALCY TO OUR STUDENTS AS POSSIBLE.

WE THANK YOU FOR YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT AND PRAYERS FOR OUR MINISTRY AND OUR STUDENTS.

### SERVICE & OUTREACH



For three decades, the InterFaith Health Clinic's mission has been to provide "accessible, affordable and quality health care to the low income, working, uninsured and under-served, primarily through the support of the religious, health care and business communities."

Services offered are primary care, dental care, eye care, mental health counseling and affordable medications. In addition to the clinic staff, there is a network of over 400 specialty physicians, dentists, and counselors who see clinic patients at their private offices and charge according to the clinic's sliding fee scale.

Second Presbyterian Church has supported InterFaith Health Clinic through our Outreach budget for many years. Second member Kim Elrod is a member of the staff. In February 2018 the 200-a-Month collection for the Clinic yielded: 30 reams of copy paper, 550 envelopes, 64 legal pads, and 499 pens.

## Highlights from the April Session Meeting

- Agreed to continue the moratorium on in-person meetings and services.
- Agreed, if he is comfortable making a decision, Reverend Reynolds can make decisions between the weekly Called Session meetings and then inform the session.
- Approved the motion to celebrate Communion by live stream on Maundy Thursday, April 9, 2020.
- Approved the motion to authorize the funding for payroll of all staff at the Preschool for a period of eight weeks. It is anticipated that the cost will be approximately \$55,000.00 and these funds would ultimately be charged to the Undesignated Mission Fund. If the Preschool were to receive reimbursement from the federal Cares program, or similar source, then it would reimburse the church. Otherwise there will be no repayment obligation.
- Received reports from the Preschool and Ministry Teams as information.
- Received the Treasurer's Report.
- Approved the motion to uphold the examination of the upcoming Elders.
- Approved the motion to seat the incoming elders on the Session of Second Presbyterian Church, with voice and vote, until such a time as they can be properly ordained/installed. A Service of Ordination/Installation shall be scheduled as soon as feasible, without undue haste or undue delay, once the decision has been made to resume in-person worship services.
- Approved the motion to make a count of incoming funds and contributions as soon as possible.
