# On Second Thought...

As we stand on the brink of a New Year, let us take a moment to look back at the year that was. Let us pause and review our lives as we lived them in the Year of Our Lord 2018. Let us look to the year-gone-by and take stock of our lives, grade ourselves on our successes and failures, and determine our direction for the coming year. Then let us make our New Year resolutions so that we may do better in the year to come.

What a bunch of bunk! We are Christians! We don't live in the past! Paul wrote, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-4) As baptized children of God we should not spend our time looking back on our lives, grading successes and failures, and focusing on what has been. We are called to a new life, focused on the future – a future that belongs to God.

For Christians, January 1st should be no different than July 17th – with the exception of the bowl games! For us, every day is a forward-facing day in which we are called to respond to God's grace by being welcoming, faithful, and hopeful witnesses to the love and forgiveness that is found at the foot of the cross upon which Christ Jesus died. The plain and simple fact is that in our baptisms we are marked and claimed as God's own. In our baptisms we are freed from slavery to sin so that we may live lives to God. In our baptisms we are dead to the past and alive to God in Christ Jesus. The only resolution we need to be concerned with is resolving to live for him!

Now, this does not mean that we should forget our past. Indeed, God's grace means so much more to us when we remember our past and realize that we are not captivated by it. But while we are called to remember our past, what we don't do is get bogged down in it or beat ourselves up over it. This takes power away from God! We repent and ask to be forgiven and then we get on with the business of living for God and not for ourselves. "The

death Christ died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God." (Rom. 6:10) What an amazing and wonderful thing that is!

Still...it seems we need to do something to mark the transition from 2018 to 2019, especially as we enter the third century of the ministry of Second Presbyterian Church. I suggest that this is a wonderful time to renew our covenant with God. While God has always been faithful to his covenant promise, we have not. We constantly sin (the actual translation of the Greek word for sin is "miss the mark") and do not uphold our part of the covenant. So we must always look for occasions and markers in our lives when we can take the opportunity to renew our baptismal vows to God. Let us then, remembering the mercies of God and the hope of his calling, take the opportunity of the New Year to examine ourselves by the light of the Spirit, that we may see where we have "missed the mark" in our faith and practice, and give ourselves anew to God so that we may be focused on the life to which we are called - a new life in Christ, redeemed from sin, and consecrated to God.



# **New Sermon Series Begins January 13th**

On Sunday, January 6th (Epiphany), we will conclude our *Sing We Now of Christmas* sermon series with the arrival of the Magi at the house where Jesus and his family were staying. The hymn will be, appropriately, *We Three Kings*. Then beginning January 13th and continuing through March, Pastors Tim and Sarah will be exploring the book of Exodus on Sunday mornings during worship. Entitled *Exodus: Journey through the Wilderness*, this sermon series will take us through the entire book of Exodus as

we follow the journey of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, through the wilderness, right up to the edge of the Promised Land. The book of Exodus contains some of our most beloved stories: the birth and calling of Moses, the Ten Plagues, the parting of the sea, the giving of the Ten Commandments, the incident of the Golden Calf, and God's covenant with Israel. Join us as we journey through the wilderness with the Israelites from now until Palm Sunday and experience God's faithfulness again and again.

# SECONDATA SUNDAYS AT

ur first Second Sunday alternative worship service will be held on January 13th at 6:00 p.m. in the Chapel. Designed to be an interactive and experiential worship service that engages the senses, as well as the mind and spirit, these worship services will offer participants a different way to engage the presence of God's Spirit than regular, traditional Sunday morning worship does. The intent is not to replace or compete with worship on Sunday morning, but to complement it. This service will also allow those who are not able to come to worship on Sunday mornings, or those for whom worship in the sanctuary on Sunday morning may be intimidating, to gather in community with others to experience God's presence in a more intimate and non-traditional way.

Our January Second Sunday service will be a lectio divina service. What is lectio divina? Well, first of all, it's Latin for "holy reading." It's meditative, it's Christian, and it's ancient. It is a prayerful,

reflective reading of God's Word as divine revelation, as the "very speech of God." Lectio divina allows a group to contemplate a selection of Scripture in a meditative way. Participants are invited to reflect on a passage in silence and then are guided in sharing words, phrases, thoughts, feelings, and questions from their time of reflection. The intent is to leave worshipers collectively open to the leading of the Holy Spirit as God's Word is heard. Sometimes lectio divina is called "listening with the ears of the heart."

The service will be simple: a few songs, a few prayers, and at the center of the service, where a sermon or homily would usually be, we will practice *lectio divina* together. We hope to see you in the chapel on Sunday, January 13th for *Second Sundays at Six!* Coming in February: Carson Newman's Christian contemporary vocal ensemble *Redemption*. And in March: Taizé worship led by members of UKirk @ UTK.

# **Wednesday Night Dinner and Programs Resume January 9th**

Our Wednesday night dinner and activities will resume on January 9th with dinner at 5:30 p.m. Even though it's not a *first* Wednesday of the month, it's the first Wednesday we'll be back! So we'll be having our *Church Family 'Round the* 

Table program. Since January 6th is Epiphany, the day when we celebrate the arrival of the Magi, our theme will be *Epiphany*. Everyone is invited to bring a baby picture with them to show to their table!

# Deadly! - A New Wednesday Night Study

This past November, a news report on WVLT said that Knoxville had been ranked #32 on a list of the "Most Sinful Cities in America." (Las Vegas, of course, ranked #1.) The criteria used to compile the list was interesting. Using data on violent crime, DUI arrests, adult entertainment per capita, and other public records, cities were ranked according to their levels of anger, jealousy, excess, greed, lust, vanity, and laziness. In case you don't recognize these – they are known as the Seven Deadly Sins! But why are these seven sins considered "deadly?" What do they encompass? And how did they come to be?

Join Pastor Tim in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesdays in January and February at 6:05 p.m. to find out! We will be looking at each of the so-called Seven Deadly Sins to see what they are all about, why they have been lifted up as the most dangerous sins, and what it all means for Christians living in the world today. Pastor Tim doesn't promise that coming to the class will help Knoxville's ranking on the list, but he does promise that you will find it interesting!



# **Second's Winter Weather Policy**
