On Second Thought..



Sharing stories is a powerful thing. Our stories weave together to create the fabric of who we are. They have shaped us in ways, both seen and unseen. They have the ability to connect us with others and the ability to set us apart. Many are fun to share while others are difficult; but sharing our stories has a way of breaking down walls. It has a way of evoking empathy or joy or connection in a way that few other things can.

This past week, we had a leak in our garage that meant we had to unearth some, now soggy, boxes that had found their way into the recesses of the garage. The box that took on the most water held many of my stories. There were things like an entire book of CDs that tell the story of my musical tastes over the years, notebooks from seminars and classes that hadn't been touched in years. These things, mementos that it was probably time to let go of anyway. (I'll admit that I'm a bit of a sentimental pack rat, and sometimes it takes a thing being completely ruined before I'll agree to get rid of it. And even then, I'll probably do my best to salvage it!)

Then, there were the things in the box that were irreplaceable – the things that my boys will have to get rid of, because I won't be able to bring myself to do it. I lost a couple of those things, like the memoir that my great-grandfather wrote, and it makes me sick. (Don't worry. I do have a second copy of that. It's proudly displayed in my office!) But somehow, some way, my "notebooks" were protected by the book of CDs and the never-to-be-read-again notes taken at a long-ago seminar. The notebooks that my grandmother compiled over the years that mark nearly every coming and going in my life, were saved in page protectors (thank goodness) and in mint condition.

These notebooks tell my story. From a detailed schedule my mom left for my grandmother when she was keeping me overnight at about 11 months old to every song I attempted to play at my piano recitals, newspaper clippings about volleyball team victories (but only the victories), church bulletins from anytime I was involved in worship in any way, school pictures through the years, and a picture of me proudly showing off the one tiny carrot our garden had produced.

These page-protected pages tell my story, and I had such a great time pulling them out of the leak-soaked boxes, flipping through the memories, and recounting the moments and milestones that made me who I am. And, I wonder, what are these stories for you? What are the things that made you who you are, and what kinds of keepsakes do you have that remind you?

As people of faith, we are part of a much larger story of the people of God – a story that we recount in worship, in Bible study, in prayer. These stories, as much as those represented by the keepsakes that are tucked away in boxes in our garages and attics, tell us who we are and how we came to be who we are. These stories are the stories of the faithful who have gone before us and who are a part of the great cloud of witnesses that surround us.

Thanks be to God for the stories and the people and the memories that make us.

The Narrative Lectionary



No doubt by now you are familiar with the Revised Common Lectionary, the three-year cycle of Scripture readings used across many different denominations for Sunday worship. So what exactly is the Narrative Lectionary and what makes it different from the Revised Common Lectionary?

The Revised Common Lectionary was designed at a time when a majority of the culture grew up in and went to church and familiarity with the Scriptures was assumed. As a result, while the Revised Common Lectionary has united the church and given it a common structure, it doesn't present Scripture in a way that helps people who are unfamiliar with Scripture to become fluent in the first language of faith and understand that the story of the Bible is one continuous story about what God is up to in and with humanity.

So, beginning in 2010, two professors at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, in partnership with congregations across America, began to experiment with a new lectionary designed to follow the overarching narrative of the Biblical story over a 9-month period. Since it follows the Biblical narrative, it was called the Narrative Lectionary.

The Narrative Lectionary is a four-year cycle of readings that are followed September through May of each year and are arranged in a narrative sequence to help people see Scripture as one story that has coherence and a dynamic movement. The texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation to the establishment of the early Christian church. The texts are chosen to show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture that proclaim what God is doing in the world. The stories tell of hope and disappointment, suffering and redemption. In all these varied contexts, we find God dealing with the complexities of human life.

The Liturgical Calendar also informs the Narrative Lectionary. In the fall, the Narrative lectionary focuses on the Hebrew Bible, moving through the story of God's dealings with Israel and culminating in Advent with the prophets who speak of longing and hope. Readings from the Gospels (a different one each year) fit the movement from Christmas and Epiphany to the Transfiguration, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, and Easter. (Stories from the gospels differ each year, avoiding repetition and highlighting what is distinctive about each gospel's telling of the story of Jesus). Then, selections from Acts and Paul's letters trace the outward movement of the resurrection message in the spring, culminating on Pentecost with readings focusing on the Holy Spirit.

We will begin following the Narrative Lectionary in worship this month with Year 1, which follows the Gospel of Matthew from Christmas to Easter. We are excited about the opportunity this brings for us to make the biblical story a more vital part of our life of faith!


